If possible, fix internet problems, such as not being able to connect to certain sites during heavier times such as pride. While this can be attributed to internet traffic, there should be a way to connect to the internet without having to get in trouble for using phones to do work.

I feel that being "thrown" into the new grading system instead of being eased into it became very difficult for me personally. They are drastically different and I feel that remediation is important because you are able to improve yourself and as a student goes up in years I feel that limiting
