1. How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

The QCSD Health and Safety Plan is informed by guidance from our federal, state, and local authorities. These include and are not limited to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Pennsylvania Department of Health (PADOH), the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE), and the Bucks County Health Department (BCHD). The QCSD will continue to work in coordination with these agencies and our local partners to develop and refine expectations that meet all requirements.

QCSD will revise this plan as necessary, based on changing guidance at any of these levels, at the required frequency. Such changes will be communicated to all stakeholders. Additionally, QCSD will monitor the recommendations of federal, state, and local authorities and adjust as necessary for all curricular, extra-curricular, and co-curricular programs including travel/field trips.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

Our methods for educational delivery for the 2021-22 school year will be:

- Instruction will resume on August 30, 2021, on a normal Monday through Friday schedule.
- The following options will be available to families:
 - o Face to face, in classroom instruction
 - Online option (Q-Flex) K-12

Student medical issues which require a temporary leave from school will be addressed on a case-by-case basis to determine appropriate instructional alternatives to continue the student's education in consideration of information provided by the student's health care provider, parent/guardians, principal, and counselor, and IEP team, if applicable

To address the issue of mental health concerns for our students and staff, the following measures will continue to be in place for the 2021-22 school year:

- School counselors and SAP (Student Assistance Program) counselors are available to provide mental health support for students and connect families with services.
- Schools will continue to utilize the SAP program to support students and families.

- One of the district's comprehensive plan goal areas, Culture for Learning, focuses on continued needs assessment and instruction in SEL (Social Emotional Learning).
- Staff will be routinely reminded of how to access the district Employee Assistance Program.
- Professional development options will continue that support mental health/stress reduction.
- Behavioral health supports will continue to be provided through our Board-Certified Behavior Analysts (BCBA).

Filters in HVAC equipment are changed in accordance with the manufacturers specifications and provide the maximum filtration possible for efficient operation of the equipment. HVAC systems are programmed to provide the maximum exchange of fresh air possible for efficient operation of the equipment. All HVAC schedules have been extended to allow for additional air exchanges while there are not any occupants in the building. Filters for HVAC equipment are

	typically changed quarterly, however during Covid we have implemented one additional filter change.

Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with theState and local healthdepartments;	 Use strategies similar to those used with influenza and other infectious diseases in the event of a confirmed case of COVID-19. Students and employees are encouraged to report positive cases of COVID 19 to their building nurse or direct supervisor. Symptomatic individuals should remain home until symptoms have resolved and they are fever-free for 24 hours without medication. Individuals should consult with their medical provider, or the school nurse, with any medical questions. Consult with the Bucks County Health Department on decisions impacting the closure or classrooms, schools, or the district.
f. <u>Diagnostic</u> and screening testing;	 Educate all stakeholders (students, staff, parents/ guardians) on the signs and symptoms of COVID-19. Students, teachers, and staff should stay home when they have signs of any infectious illness and be referred to their healthcare provider. The nurse or designated employee will evaluate any individual who presents with symptoms consistent with Policy and AR 203 and the recommendations of the Bucks County Department of Health. Emergency contacts must be up to date. A symptomatic student must be picked up within an hour and will not be sent home on the bus.
g. Efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities;	 Continue to work with BCDH to provide opportunities for students and community members to receive vaccinations. District communication mechanisms will be used to distribute information regarding vaccination clinics and designated hours when appropriate.

Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and	 Director of Pupil Services, IEP case managers, school nurses, principals, and counselors will work with families to develop a student-specific education plan for students with complex needs. The district will also collaborate with BCIU and other education providers to coordinate plans for students with complex needs.
i. Coordination with state and local health officials.	 Regular communication will continue with the Bucks County Department of Health regarding potential implementation of updated guidance from the PDE, CDC and other health officials.
